# Geographical information system and support for monitoring road projects: the case of Projects jointly funded by the Ministry of Public Works.

**Abstract: Context:** Since the 1960s, abbreviated geographic information systems, more commonly GIS, which are techniques combining cartography with databases, have emerged thanks to a grouping of information structured and organized in a certain logic in the computer tool called server. Our study focuses on jointly funded road projects. The latter comes up against the inaccessibility of remote work data since they are poorly archived; it is necessary to ask how to continue the control, and the correct archiving of the data of these projects so that we can have remote access and in real time if necessary?

**Objective:** Development of a geographic information and road project monitoring tool based on a multifunctional database.

**Material and method:** data collection with excel software and a smartphone, close to the project engineers, presentation of the processing and analysis processes of the acquired data (georeferencing which made it possible to set all the layers in the same repository, the digitalization of the linear concerned) as well as the development of the database followed by the design of the tools and production of the maps of the various projects.

**Results**: Implementation of a webmapping tool for the archives and remote data access consisting of a database supported by a dynamic information exchange tool and a cartographic interface configured for publication, visualization, project mapping.

**Conclusion**: This tool must allow the archiving of data from work already carried out, remote access to this data, monitoring of the progress of work, as well as the visualization of the cartography of the various works built.

## Introduction

The Cameroonian Government has relied on the strategy defined in the Strategy Document for Growth and Employment (DSCE) in which it reaffirms its desire to pursue the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), to develop its development projects. Its road projects also respond to the guidelines of Cameroon's transport sector policy, which emphasizes on the importance of road infrastructure development with a view to their contribution to economic growth, poverty reduction, improvement of access to basic social services, the opening up of rural areas, as well as regional integration. Some targeted roads are part of the priorities of the Consensual Master Plan for Transport in Central Africa (PDCT-AC) of ECCAS which aims to increase trade between the capitals of ECCAS. Others will contribute by increasing trade and strengthening cooperation between ECCAS countries and those of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) in general, and particularly between Cameroon and Nigeria. It should be noted that several of these infrastructures, in some specific road projects, are financed by technical and financial partners (BM, ADB, JICA, BDEAC, EU, AFD, BID, etc.). These projects are piloted in Cameroon by the Jointly Funded Road Projects Unit (CPR-FC) created by the Order No. 018 / PM of March 09, 2020 of the Prime Minister, Head of Government and is placed under the authority of the Minister of Works Public. Since its creation, several projects have been carried out but we realize that the data is not archived; it is noticed that some projects are not well documented. And also, there is a serious communication problem between the various stakeholders in these projects; we also noticed the accumulation of papers in the offices which cannot resist for a long time sometimes because of the climate as well as the loss of certain project data when the person in charge of the documents leaves the structure and also the impossibility to get access to the data from a distance.

The overall objective of this work is therefore to set up a dynamic tool to help monitor joint-funded road projects to allow not only the storage of data but also remote access to this data if necessary, by the different actors.

## 1. Methodology

The methodology adopted consisted mainly of a survey of the jointly funded road projects unit of the Ministry of Public Works, data collection, analysis of the data collected and development of the webGeo tool.

#### 1.1 Historical background and location

As part of the implementation and monitoring of the execution of road projects including the financial support by the World Bank (WB) and the African Development Bank (AfDB), the Government of Cameroon by de decret N°\_ 025/CAB/PM of February 13, 2008 setup a unit called BAD/BM-MINTP, unit modified and supplemented by order N°\_ 018/PM of March 9, 2020 on the organization and operation of the project units joint-financed road (CPR-FC) of the Ministry of Public Works. It is placed under the authority of the Minister of Public Works.

Located in Yaoundé at the delegation of the Ministry of Public Works located opposite to the municipal lake.

## 1.2. Data Collect

The data collected is of two types, namely the data on the offer and the realization of the projects which we have called attribute data and the data on the location which we have called cartographic data.

## 1.2.1. Project attribute data

We have collected data on projects piloted by the CPR-FC from 2010 to the present day. This data included general information on the projects such as the name of the project or program, the different lots of the project, the loan agreement number by the funder, the different donors, the amount of credit mobilized by each donor, the total budget of the project, the date of approval, date of loan agreement, date of start of the project, the duration of the project, the roject manager, the client and the company which carried out the project as well as the nationality of the company and that of the control mission. These data are recorded in a table 1.

## 1.2.2. Project mapping data

To obtain the cartographic data, we started from the downloaded Cameroon road map file and then we carried out several GIS operations, in particular the digitization of our road sections in order to be able to produce the cartography of each project.

## 1.3. Development of the database and webGeo tools

## 1.3.1. Development of the database

In our case, to develop our database system we will have as method of analysis that of Merise in which we will present MCD, MLD and MPD. Modeling according to the MERISE formalism. The modeling was based on the MERISE formalism with the PowerDesigner software. Subsequently, taking into account the spatial and geometric dimensions of the objects constituting the road project data that required another model specific to GIS. Regarding the formalism of MERISE, this method allows us to analyze and design project data information systems. It is mainly based on three steps: First the Conceptual Data Model (CDM, with the Entity-Association model), then the Physical Data Model (PDM) and finally the Logical Data Model (LDM, relational). The language used here is SQL. TThe DBMS is PostgreSQL that we will use its PostGIS extension which allows us to manage the cartography.

## 1.3.2. Development of the webGeo tool

In this part of the design, we will use the MVC model for the structuring of web pages and the programming languages are PHP and html.

## General methodology

After creating the database with PostgreSQL and connecting it to the Qgis mapping software, we installed the GeoServer mapping server which will allow us to publish our GIS data and finally we will connect it to the DB.

## 2.1.4. WebGeo operating tools

## • Layers table

It is a table that lists all the layers that we use to produce the cartography of each project. And on this table we can check and uncheck the layers we want to see or not; which avoids making the map bulky.

## • Zoom Tool

As an online map, the zoom tool is essential; that's why in our webGeo we have two ways to zoom. The first is to use Scale (located on the right of the web page), when we click on this option, a list of several scales appears so we choose which one we want to use. The second way is the easiest and best known when we are on a map. Indeed, in this case, you just have to click on the symbols + (to zoom in) or - (to zoom out). On a smartphone, the zoom is done just by placing two fingers on our screen, spreading them apart or closing them.

## • Selection tool

This tool helps when you want to view the map and you want to have information about a specific place, then just click on it, then a request will be made on the server which contains the database and it gives you all the information related to what you clicked on.

## 2.2. Discussions

## 2.2.1. Analysis

The tools developed will allow managers and the various project stakeholders to get advantages such as:

- Remote access to project data;
- Digital archiving of project data so as not to lose it
- Reducing the congestion rate of documents and searching through piles of physical documents when information is needed;
- ✤ The publication of the cartographic representation of each project.

## 2.2.2. Recommendations

- Develop in-house software tools for the automation of topographic and more particularly cartographic tasks such as the digitization and assembly of cartographic data for each project;
- Acquire a more efficient computer for viewing all raster elements (NVIDIA RTX graphics card);
- Focus on geographical data in the production of reports.

## Conclusion

The main objective of this work was to set up an information system through a dynamic tool to help monitor jointfunded road projects. The webGeo application developed during this work is a tool for viewing, creating/editing and archiving project information. It will allow access to information on road projects and its control by making it available on the Internet. From an architectural point of view, the developed webGeo tool is composed of a DBMS (PostgreSQL/PostGIS) inside which stores the text data as well as the layers in shapefiles and SLD files (for style management maps), a web application that interacts with users and a cartographic server (GeoServer to publish the maps of the various projects). This project is a tool to help manage and communicate the various project data with the contribution of new GIS technologies; the work was divided into several parts.

First, it was a question of presenting our methodological approach; it was as follows: first, we did an analysis of our needs with the definition of our systems; then from this definition flowed the conceptual, physical and logical modeling of our data by following the formalism of MERISE (which consists in analyzing, designing and creating geographic information systems); after the modeling we have processed it and imported our spatial data under PostgreSQL; from this then flowed the cartography of the road projects, then the configuration of our Cartographic servers; and the design of the Webmapping tool finally we published our maps online with GeoServer.

In the results, we presented our webGeo tool (its functionalities, its interface, the different tabs and the tools). Finally, to complete this part, we made analyzes on our database as well as on the tool by showing the advantages which it could bring in the realization of the projects.
